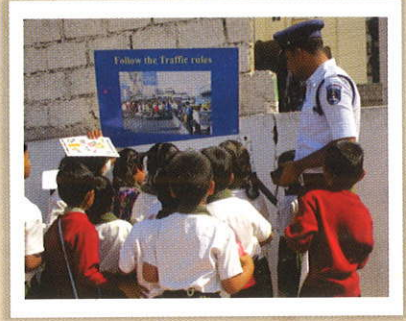


Traffic Park

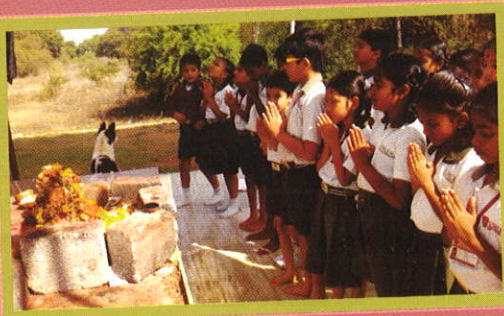
Pre-Primary Activities

Home Science & Health and Wellness

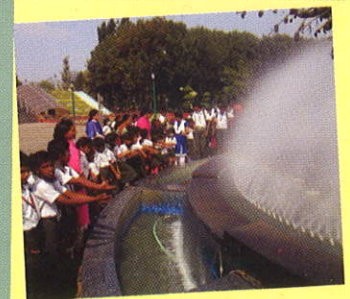

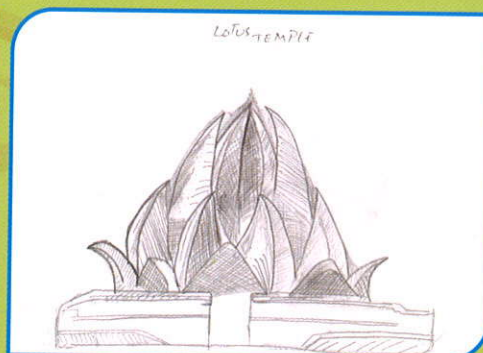
IHC competition

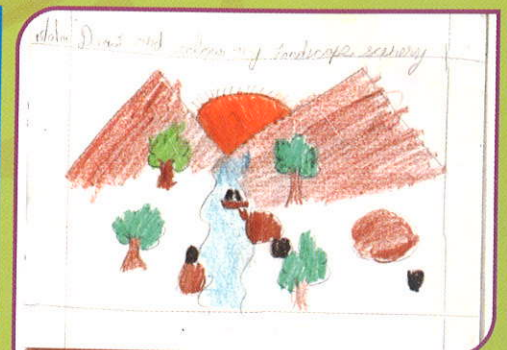

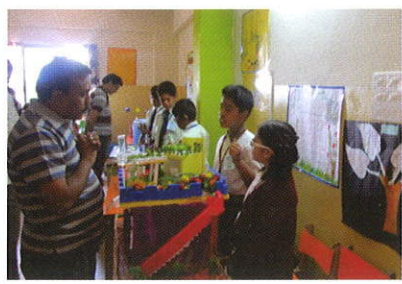
