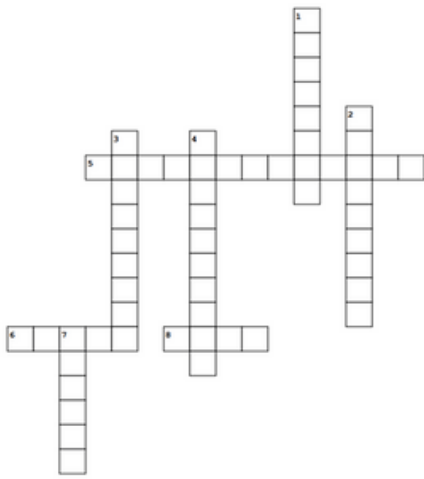
Hygiene and Sanitation

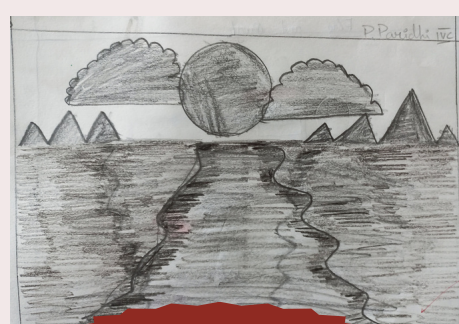
